



2017-2018 Course Descriptions.

OT= Old Testament.

OT101 The Book of Esther. An in-depth study of this book brings the student to a greater understanding of the Providence (Sovereignty) of God.

OT201 Genesis Chapters 1-11. A clear understanding of some of the most disputed chapters in the Bible. A must for students so they may be more prepared to answer questions from family, friends and co-workers.

OT301 Ancient Civilizations I. Who were the various people groups in the Bible? What were they like? How do they interact with God's people? Learn all this and more in this dynamic course.

OT302 Ancient Civilizations II. A continuation of OT301. Students are not required to take OT301 in order to take OT302.

OT401 The Jewish Roots of Christianity. Learn about the manners and customs of the Jewish people in the Bible. Their feasts. Their festivals. Their manners and customs.

OT501 The Tower of Babel and the New World Order. Much, if not all, modern day paganism, cults, and political systems can trace their roots back to the Tower of Babel. Learn all about it in this course.

OT601 The Book of Daniel. One of the most remarkable books in the Bible. Spanning from the Babylonian captivity all the way to the end of time and further. A must course for the serious student of prophecy.

OT701 Ancient Egypt in the Bible. An in-depth study of the Egyptian civilization and how they relate to the Old Testament narrative.

OT801 Introduction to Biblical Hebrew. This course will teach the student how to read and write the Hebrew language which is the language of the Old Testament.

OT802 Biblical Hebrew I. For those who took OT801 this course goes to the next level of study. It is a pre-requisite to have taken OT801 unless the student can show the professor they have mastered the basics of Biblical Hebrew.

NT= New Testament.

NT101 First Corinthians. A detailed study of this book which addresses many of the issues so frequent in the local Church as well as the individual Christian life.

NT201 Disciple Making. Called to make disciples as a mandate from Matthew 28:18-20 this course will help you do just that.

NT301 Ministry Leadership. Not just for those called to ministry but for those who are leading a Sunday school class or a home Bible study or even a small group ministry.

NT401 The Life of Christ. A sweeping overview of the life, ministry, death, burial and resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

NT501 I, II, III John, Jude. These short but powerful books will challenge you to a deeper devotion and stronger walk with the Lord.

NT601 Reaching America in the 21st Century. Though we are in the 21st century the issues and challenges are still the same as those found in the Bible. This course will help you to bridge the gap between the Bible and our culture.

NT701 Two Tremendous Archaeological Discoveries. What are they? How do they impact our lives? How do they confirm the veracity of the Scriptures? You need to take this course to find out.

TH= Theology.

TH101 Suffering and Brokenness in the Christians Life. Not just how and why we suffer but how to let it make us the men and women that God called us to be. From ashes to beauty.

TH201 Theology I. Any student of the Bible must have a firm understanding of the basics of Biblical theology. Theology is the “study of God.” Everyone has a “theology.” The question is, “Is it good theology?” A must course for all Bible students.

TH202 Theology II. A continuation of TH201. Though TH201 is not a pre-requisite for this course it is helpful for the student.

TH301 Bible Study Methods. Any student of the Bible needs to know what “tools” of Bible study are out there and how to use those “tools” to have a more effective and Biblically sound Bible study methodology.

TH401 The Relevance of Creation. Still one of the most hotly debated subjects between believers and non-believers. This course will help you be more confident to share your faith and answer those tough questions about Creation versus evolution.

TH501 Hermeneutics I. This course will give you the proper skills as to how to study, read, interpret and understand correctly the Biblical text. Definitely a must course for the serious Bible study student.

TH502 Hermeneutics II. A continuation of TH501. Though TH501 is not a pre-requisite for TH502 it is recommended that the student be aware of the challenge of the courses without TH501.

TH601 Understanding the Trinity. Arguably the most difficult topic in the Scriptures and in the Church. Though a “mystery” the Trinity is not an enigma. It can be understood and it does make Biblical sense.

GS= General Studies.

GS101 Christian Foundation for America’s Political Philosophy I. This course will help the student understand the background for our political documents that shaped the country and why it matters so much today to have this important information.

GS102 Christian Foundation for America’s Political Philosophy II. A continuation of GS101. Though GS101 is not a pre-requisite for GS201 it is helpful to have taken it in order to follow the lectures more closely.

GS201 The Unseen Realm. A look at what the Bible teaches about what we do not see yet is just as real as what we do see!

GS301 Public Speaking. Ever have to give a public prayer, a short introduction to a small group, a brief Bible lesson at Sunday school class or other public address? Then you need this course! It will help build you confidence not just in a “public” venue but in one-on-one witnessing.

GS401 Apologetics. This course will help you be prepared to answer questions about the Bible and other topics. Also, it will help the student to clearly think through questions posed by others and to look of the rational or irrational viewpoints they pose.
